

## Janet Friberg Jarrett

Janet Friberg Jarrett, the only child of Richard and Louise Friberg, was born and raised in Miami, Florida, and graduated from Coral Gables High School . Janet attended Wesleyan College in Macon, Georgia, where she graduated in 1978 with a double major in American Studies and English. Janet returned to Miami after graduation and started her long career in the legal side of real estate.

Janet later moved to the Atlanta, Georgia area where she earned a Masters Degree in Heritage Preservation in 2004 from Georgia State University. Janet had hoped to work in a historic area or museum, but she was unable to begin a new career at that time. Janet moved to Louisville, Kentucky in 2003 to marry her college sweetheart.
