

GLORIOUS by Becky Osbourn President, NLASAR REFLECTIONS Congress 2024

If you attended the 134th SAR National Congress in Lancaster, Pennsylvania with your Compatriot, you enjoyed a warm welcome from the host society, the PennsylvaniaSociety, Sons of the American Revolution, and their companions, the Pennsylvania Ladies Auxiliary SAR. A region steeped in history, Lancaster was the capital of the American Colonies for one day in 1777.

July 11, 2024, attendees toured the Valley Forge Encampment, walking the very ground where Washington and his troops encamped the winter of 1777-1778, SAR leadership dedicated a 250th anniversary granite bench in front of the Washington Memorial Chapel "commemorating all who served on these fields during the winter of 1777-1778 in determined pursuit of liberty and independence."


On July 12th, First Lady Karen Dodd hosted The First Lady's Tea following the Memorial Service at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

Saturday was the National Ladies Auxiliary General Membership Meeting. Speaker Dr. James McMahon, Jr., Curator and Director of Collections of Lancaster History served previously as senior curator and director of the former Hershey Museum. What a sweet treat to learn from an experienced historian about Milton Hershey's sweet beginnings right there in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Kudos to President Pat Wilson-Perkins for presiding and guiding the NLASAR in foundational achievements, including NLASAR Bylaws revisions and authorizing modernizing NLASAR's website. Members voted to honor the memory of past president Billie Brock with a donation to the SAR Museum and Learning Center's collection in her name: a garnet and silver, period-appropriate "Lace Pin."

Pennsylvania planned an afternoon meal at picturesque and park-like Cameron Estate Inn for the Ladies Luncheon. Dressed in colonial attire, our speaker provided the history behind the Donegal Presbyterian Church that began in the 1720's and is forever tied to the Cameron Estate both by proximity and history.



Colonial Campanions



CATHARINE LITTLEFIELD GREENE

The widow of Revolutionary War hero Nathanael Greene, Catharine Littlefield Greene, known as 'Caty' to her friends, demonstrated strength as a military wife, acumen as a businesswoman, and creativity as a contributor to the invention of the cotton gin.

According to historians, Catharine's life had many facets. As the 'camp wife' of the General, she entertained dignitaries, a grande mistress of two Georgian plantations, a close friend of George and Martha Washington, a business partner of Eli Whitney, the inventor of the cotton gin.

She was born on December 17, 1753/1755, in Rhode Island, the second child of John Littlefield and Phebe Ray. Her mother, Phebe, was a direct descendant of Rhode Island colony founder Roger Williams. Her childhood was happy and marked by freedoms not commonly afforded other women at that time. Her mother died in 1761 and Caty was raised by her Aunt Catharine Ray Greene, for whom she was named. The home was an open place of Patriotism support.

Caty and Nathanael's days as newlyweds were happy but brief, as he was summoned for military duty after the Battle of Lexington and Concord on April 19, 1775.

Catharine was a mother and she traveled with Greene to encampments during the war. She was at Valley Forge. After her husband's death in 1786, Greene assumed the management of their Georgia plantation. There is much more to her life's story and of course, partnership with Eli Whitney. Caty died of malaria on September 2, 1814.

Mobility scooters are available for rent, but please make reservations early. Parking at the resort is complimentary. Your room key will entitle you to many discounts at the restaurants and shops and even \$10 of free gaming in the casino.


